Maryland's nonprofit organizations provide childcare, employment and training programs, education, arts, recreation, religious and cultural activities, housing, health care, social services and so much more. The success of Maryland's nonprofits depends upon public confidence and support. There are many ways to give to nonprofit organizations the support they need during the holiday season and throughout the year!

A few examples of gifts given to charities include: cash or checks, stocks and other marketable securities, planned donations (including gifts through wills, insurance, charitable gift annuities, charitable trust pooled income funds), personal property (such as clothing, food, or household items), and donations of real property (such as land, automobiles, boats). Of course, it is always a good idea to contact the organization before sending an out-of-the-ordinary or unusual gift. Not all nonprofits are able to accept each type of gift. For instance, nonprofits might have a shortage of storage space, might have a narrowly defined mission, or might not have the expertise needed to handle certain unique gifts.
